

## A Century of Faith Celebrated by Two Area Churches

Both St. John's Catholic Church in Strawn and St. Boniface Catholic Church in Dodson Prairie celebrated 100th anniversaries in 2012.

#### The Little Church on the Prairie

In a land of farm houses and fields lies a tiny little community called Dodson Prairie. Today, "The Prairie," as it is known, is home to only a handful of families. On June 9, 2012, the population grew by approximately 250 as the St. Boniface Catholic Church held its 100th anniversary celebration. Friends and family gathered for a day of praise, reunions, and fellowship.

In the early 1900s, Dodson Prairie was established by about a dozen German & Czech families (including the Holubs, Schlinders, Beyers, Nowaks, Teichmans, Popps, Boyds, Ankenbauers, and others) who had immigrated in the 1850's and settled near Dubina & Schulenburg in south Texas.
