

Strawn Volunteer Fire Department is proud of their new fire truck which recently arrived. It is a pumper truck that holds 1000 gallons of water and has a 1750 gallonper-minute pump. The truck cost approximately \$305,000.00. Through careful budgeting and a generous grant of \$30,000 from the Buckets & Boots Foundation, Strawn VFD only had to finance \$105,000.00.

Voter Registration for the November 5th Election is Monday, October 7, 2013. The State of Texas now requires a photo ID when voting in person. Acceptable forms of ID are TX Drivers License, Election Identification Certificate or personal identification card, all issued by TX DPS.
