Two Alderman Vacancies Filled

Two new Aldermen have been appointed to fill vacant seats on the Strawn City Council. In April, Jeff Greenwood was appointed to fill the seat vacated by Scott Parsons. Parsons took a position with the City that required him to resign. Greenwood and his fiancé Courtney Allen moved to Strawn in 2012, and he is employed with Union Pacific. On August 27, Esequiel Rodriguez was sworn in to fill the Alderman seat previously held by Benny Brock. The Council voted at the August 12 meeting to select Rodriguez, who is a long-time

Strawn resident and works for Butler Memorials.

Bid Accepted for New Water Line

City Council reviewed bids received from four companies for construction of a new water line that will run on the east side of the City. The City has previously received a \$275,000 grant for the new 8-inch water line. Board members unanimously accepted the low bid from Roberts Construction for \$227,855. 
